Over the past six years, our team has thoroughly enjoyed connecting and working with individuals who are curious about web archives.

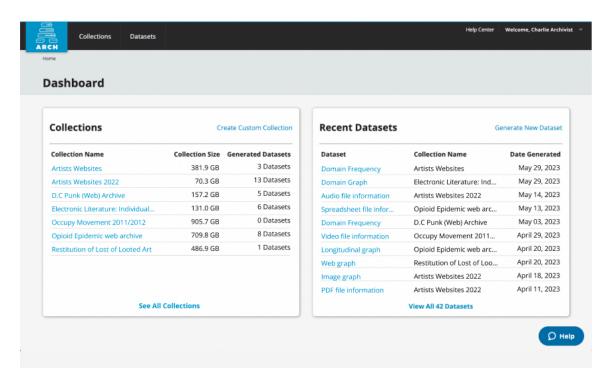
Our work has been motivated by the vision of reducing the barriers facing scholars when working with born-digital data at scale.

## **Build, Access, Analyze: Introducing ARCH** (Archives Research Compute Hub)

Alongside our friends at the Internet Archive, we <u>were very excited</u> to announce the launch of ARCH (Archives Research Compute Hub), a new research and education service that lets users easily build, access, and analyze digital collections computationally at scale. ARCH brings together the Internet Archive's experience supporting computational research for more than a decade by

providing large-scale data to researchers and dataset-oriented service integrations like ARS (Archive-it Research Services) with the Archives Unleashed project. The development of ARCH was supported in part by generous funding from the Mellon

Foundation.

# Celebrating Research Opportunities with Web Archive through Archives Unleashed Cohort Projects



Following the successes of the <u>Archives Unleashed datathon</u> series (2017–2020), the Archives Unleashed Cohort Program launched in 2021 to foster research engagement with web archives.

The program has seen two cycles  $[\underline{2021/2022}]$  and  $\underline{2022/2023}$  of

year-long intensive collaborations to support research with web archives as a primary data source and scholarly objects. The Archives Unleashed Cohort roster includes ten incredible projects by fifty researchers from twenty institutions.

At the end of June, we hosted our second group of Cohort participants at the beautiful Internet Archive Canada facility in Vancouver. This was our final event and marked the culmination of our six years as the Archives Unleashed project.

<u>Launching the Archives Research Compute Hub (ARCH).</u> After three years of development, testing, and research application, we

are happy to announce the ARCH platform. Bringing together engineering, operations, and engagement activities, ARCH is the culminating piece for the Archives Unleashed Project and our integrated collaborations with the Internet Archive. ARCH adds value to the web archiving and research community by allowing users to easily build, access, and analyze digital collections computationally at scale.

Feature Implementations with ARCH. In preparation for sharing ARCH with the community, three additional features were implemented to enhance and complement the research process.

Visit ARCH for a comprehensive look at all features and services

- Introducing direct links to Notebooks. By seamlessly connecting Google Colaboratory with ARCH-generated datasets, users can conduct initial analysis on web archives through pre-set computational notebooks.
- Building Collections + Custom Filtering. One of the biggest challenges of working with web archive collections is their size! Users can refine datasets by applying filters which empower users to focus analysis on relevant content and create manageable datasets.
- Publishing. Users can now openly publish datasets in line with best practices in reproducible research. All published datasets will be preserved in perpetuity, which promotes transparency, accessibility, and collaboration.

**AUT 1.2.0 Release**. In November 2022, the 1.2.0 version of the Archives Unleashed Toolkit was released, making it a stable product available to the community under the broader Mellonfunded Archives Unleashed Project. Check out the <u>AUT 1.2.0</u> feature highlights.

**Cohort Program**. Over the past two years, we have worked with 50 interdisciplinary scholars through year-long intensive collaborations to support research with web archives as primary data sources and scholarly objects. During the course of the program, research teams were provided technical and academic mentorship to steward projects.

**Community Engagement**. Our team has engaged with supporters, collaborators, and the community by attending and presenting at recent conferences to share project progress.
